



Corps Colours, which form the basis of regimental ties, flags, stable belts, etc, are, in sequence and proportion:

Blue (Navy blue shade) 4 Parts

Marks intimate connections with the Royal Navy and blue was the colour of uniform facing for over 100 years.

Yellow (Old gold shade) 1 Part

Distinctive colour of dress and ensigns of the Duke of York and Albany's Maritime Regiment of Foot.

Green (Light Infantry green shade) 1 Part

Originally worn on shako by infantry of the Corps and perpetuated in bugle strings of the RMLI.

Red (Red drummer shade) 2 Parts

Historic colour of British Army and worn by the infantry of the Corps from the earliest times.

Blue — 4 Parts (as above).
